Kraków is an element of the world's cultural heritage. For Poland it is both a den and a reliquary, and at the same time a cradle of national identity.

For centuries this city has been the backdrop for the most special events for the nation: these took place at Wawel, in the Market Square, on the Old Town's streets, in the townhouses and palaces, as well as the strongholds and monasteries of the city. The town of Krak was the venue for Polish monarchs' coronations and funerals. It is a place where welcoming and farewell ceremonies were organised for national heroes, it is the venue of jubilees and benefit concerts. Finally, as early as in the 14th century, on the occasion of a festival organised by Kraków councillor Mikołaj Wierzynek, who held a dinner for the most important kings and emperors in Europe – the world saw how to host VIPs at a table abounding with food.

From time immemorial Kraków has been attracting visitors from the most distant parts of our globe with its unique atmosphere, traditions, legends and intangible *genius loci*, which have made the stay here inspiring both for artists and common people. Such persons as Goethe, Liszt, Balzac and Conrad all walked Kraków's streets, and Miłosz rightly summarised the magic of this city – as the borderline between this and another world.

The space of Kraków is filled with history, art, architecture, legends and lyrical nostalgia; here, a monumental past harmoniously interweaves with the richness of contemporary artistic, cultural, academic, business and social life.



The dowry that contemporary Kraków received from its epic history includes the biggest network of monuments in Poland – more than 6,000 priceless architectural structures, as well as the biggest national collection of art.

Therefore, no outstanding imagination is needed to see that the one-of-a-kind potential of our historic buildings is an original panorama for all kinds of ceremonies, conferences, banquets, black-tie events, jubilees and concerts. It is both unconventional and unique scenery.

Such venues include the interiors of Kraków's historic museum buildings, stylish city palaces, the noble walls of the Jagiellonian University, Gothic and Renaissance castle chambers or the underground chambers at Wieliczka Salt Mine which recall the Middle Ages. There is also the cult Noworolski café, which is compared by foreign visitors to the Café Greco in Rome, or the 19th century Dutch boat anchored on the banks of the Vistula. The problem you will face will be what to choose.

We'd like to recommend some places to you which are particularly worth visiting. All of them guarantee not only a unique local for your meetings in Kraków, but also offer luxurious catering, modern multimedia infrastructure and professional services supported by experience.

Archaeological Museum in Kraków

The Archaeological Museum is the oldest archaeological museum in Poland – it has been operating since 1850. It is located in the complex of St Michael's edifices. From the 9th to the 13th centuries the fortifications of the settlement of Okół made of wood and soil were located in this place, which were replaced in the 14th century by the city walls. From the 17th century it was the monastery complex of Discalced Carmelites, while in the partition period the Austrian authorities transformed the building into a prison.

The museum collection (approx. 500,000 exhibits) come from archaeological excavations, as well as from donations from discoverers and collectors.

The museum has great experience in the organisation of banquets, concerts and social events, and works with some of Kraków's best restaurants. Guests have at their disposal a large, beautiful garden where one may install tents, interesting lightning and even a concert stage.

Baltazar Fontana Room – Krzysztofory Palace

The Krzysztofory Palace is one of the most beautiful city palaces in Kraków. Its name derives from St Christopher, the patron of the palace, whose Medieval statue used to ornament the façade. Today the building is the home of Historical Museum of the City of Kraków.

The first floor of the palace is organised in the form of en suite Chambers, including the Baltazar Fontana Room, the most representative place in the Palace. Its name is a tribute to a famous Italian sculptor and stucco-worker Baltazar Fontana. In this place, filled with the portraits of the old Kraków inhabitants, one may admire the artists' work – the ceiling stucco Phaeton's Fall, referring to the mythology.

The Room is used for the purpose of concerts, banquets, conferences and small theatre performances.

Barbican

The Barbican is the most interesting of Kraków's Medieval strongholds and one of few buildings of this type which have been preserved in Europe. It was erected in the Gothic style in the period 1498-1499, partially with the use of brick and partially of stone. It is located on the so-called Royal Tract which used to be the route of coronation corteges and funeral conducts of Polish monarchs.

It used to be surrounded by a semi-circular moat, approx. 26 m wide and 6 m deep, which made this fortress impossible to conquer. Today, it is a venue for historical events, concerts, and presentations of court dancing to Medieval music.

The Barbican is a branch of the Historical Museum of the City of Kraków, which offers the possibility of hiring this facility during the summer for the purpose of company events, business meetings, banquets and concerts.

Benedictine Abbey in Tyniec

The Benedictine Abbey in Tyniec, founded in the Middle of the 11th century, is the oldest existing monastery in Poland. The picturesque location at the rocky banks of Vistula and nearly one thousand years of eventful history and rich tradition make this venue an attractive destination for the inhabitants of Kraków and tourists.

When the works involving the reconstruction of the former abbey library ended in 2008, the Benedictine Culture Institute "Chronic Dobro" (*Protect the Good*) was created. It organises retreats, development workshops and cultural events. The Institute offers several rooms with the necessary technical equipment for organisation of formal dinners and banquets; there are also comfortable guests rooms.

What is more, the abbey offers other facilities: a museum, a bookshop, a café with a panoramic terrace of the picturesque Vistula valley, a restaurant and a shop with Benedictine products.

Bishop Erazm Ciołek Palace – Branch of the National Museum in Kraków

A Gothic-Renaissance Palace (1501-1503) of the bishop of Plock, an outstanding patron of art, is one of the greatest monuments of residential architecture in Kraków. It was designed and erected at the beginning of the 16th century by architects and stone masons employed at that time to perform works at the Wawel castle.

The Bishop Erazm Ciołek Palace is a home to two art collections which complement each other and together present a picture of art from the period of the Republic of Both Nations in their "Art of Old Poland. The 12th-18th Century" and the "Orthodox Art of the Old Polish Republic" exhibitions.

The Museum hires out its historic interiors for the purpose of organisation of official dinners, cocktails, banquets and business meetings: the Room of Virtues and Hetman Room. There is also the original space of the Renaissance yard surrounded by the Palace wings and the external yard, arranged in the form of a lapidarium.

Blessed Jakub Strzemię Room

The Blessed Jakub Strzemię room is located in the oldest part of the Franciscan monastery in Kraków and is used by the Franciscan Seminary. It was erected in the 13th century, which is proven, inter alia, by the historic Gothic window and the floor level which corresponds to the level of Kraków's streets in the Middle Ages. In the 17th century, the room was renovated and given Baroque style. During the post-war period, it hosted the Kraków crib museum for many years.

Currently the period interiors of the Blessed Jakub room are used as a meeting place for scientists and business people. The adjacent St. Maksymilian room provides a perfect back office for the organisation of formal receptions, cocktails and banquets. It is also hired for various ceremonies and events which comply with the historic and spiritual nature of this place.

Gallery of 19th-Century Polish Art in the Sukiennice

The history of the Sukiennice, or Cloth Hall, dates back to the Middle Ages. In the Middle of the 14th century, in the place of the previous 13th century stands, a Gothic hall was erected, which was subsequently rebuilt in the Renaissance style in the period 1556-1560. In the 19th century, the building started to perform representative functions – it was the venue of great balls and patriotic ceremonies. It was also the first home of the National Museum in Kraków.

The Gallery of 19th-Century Polish Art in the Sukiennice is divided into "The Bacciarelli Room: Enlightenment", the adjacent "The Michałowski Room: Romanticism. Towards the National Art", as well as "The Siemiradzki Room: Around the Academy" and "The Chełmoński Room: Realism, Polish Impressionism, Beginnings of Symbolism".

For the purposes of banquets, cocktails, concerts and business meetings the museum makes available the conference room and two exhibition rooms.

Jagiellonian University Museum

The Collegium Maius is the oldest university building in Poland, and was erected in the 15th century. The Jagiellonian University Museum has a rich collection of historic scientific tools that are famous worldwide. Its collection of paintings comprises works by outstanding artists from Poland and western Europe; one should also mention the collection of Medieval sculpture. The permanent exhibition includes the Libraria, i.e. the old library, the Jagiellonian Room in which the doctor honoris causa title is awarded; the Stuba Communis – an old meeting and dining place of the university's professors, and the Treasury where the famous Jagiellonian Globe is deposited.

The Collegium Maius is a unique place which makes its stylish historic interiors available to organisers of formal dinners, cocktails, banquets and business meetings.

Jan Noworolski Café

100th anniversary of its existence, which will last until 2012. It was founded by a famous confectioner from Lviv, Jan Noworolski. The original interiors of the premises on the ground floor of Sukiennice attracted the entire Kraków elite with its unique and elegant atmosphere. Noworolski achieved an outstanding success. The café became the main meeting place for intellectuals in the pre-war period. Its guests included University professors, physicians, artists and art lovers.

From 1992, the company has been managed by the great grandson of the founder, Wojciech Noworolski, who restored the former splendour of the cult Kraków café, now admired by tourists from all over the world and compared to the "Florian" from San Marco in Venice and Café Greco in Rome. Currently it is both a patisserie, a café and a restaurant, and also produces ice creams and liqueurs.

Juliusz Słowacki Theatre in Kraków

Juliusz Słowacki Theatre is one of the most famous and recognized Polish theatres, which has been operating since 1893. Its building is classified as one of the most precious monuments of theatre architecture in Europe. The caption on the facade reads: "Kraków for the national art." The interiors are decorated by fresco by a Vienna artist, Anton Tuch, and a famous curtain by Henryk Siemiradzki. Next to the stage, there is a historic dressing room of Ludwik Solski, a great actor.

Apart from its own artistic activity, the theatre offers its premises for hire. A beautiful, three-level air-conditioned audience and period foyer are a perfect venue for the organisation of jubilees, business meetings, banquets and ceremonies. The theatre is perceived as a luxurious „Kraków's salon” and a place of elitist meetings.

Korzkiew Castle

Korzkiew Castle – a knights' stronghold from the 14th century, famous for many legends and secrets, is located in the picturesque surroundings of the Ojców National Park. It used to be one of the fortresses forming a chain of strongholds, later referred to as the Trail of the Eagles' Nests.

Thanks to the restoration works, the castle has been adopted to an intimate boutique hotel with spacious ballrooms and conference rooms.

Today the Castle offers its guests period interiors of four residential chambers, characterised by unique fittings and high standards. Sophisticated details of the interior design, fire in the fireplaces, forged handrails, portraits of ancestors... and a warm, homely atmosphere inside. In the Medieval walls of the castle one can still find the unique climate of the past, the traces of our ancestors, authentic history and ancient secrets.

Kościuszko Mound in Kraków

The Tadeusz Kościuszko Mound commemorates the hero of the Polish and American nations, who participated in the War of Independence in the US, incited the anti-Russian insurrection in the Republic of Poland and was the Chief Leader of the Armed National Forces in the insurrection of 1794.

The fort's premises near the Mound, in the rooms of the Kościuszko Museum, are used as a venue for organisation of banquets and business meetings, which in good weather can be moved to the internal yard of the Bastion, which is partly roofed and equipped with a small stage.

There is also a café with vast terraces. One of many attractions for banquet participants is the possibility to visit the Mound and admire the panorama of the city and its surroundings from the top, and at night – the panorama of a beautifully lit Kraków.

The Main Building of the National Museum in Kraków is located in the city centre, on 3 Maja Ave. The building, designed by Bolesław Szmidt, Czesław Boratyński and Edward Kreisler, was erected, with several interruptions, between 1934-1989. It is a monumental edifice, visible from a long distance.

The Main Building hosts three permanent galleries: "Arms and Colours in Poland", "Gallery of Decorative Art" and "Gallery of 20th Century Polish Art".

For the purposes of banquets, cocktails and business meetings, the museum has two rooms located on the ground floor: the temporary exhibition room and a smaller room, referred to as the 'Samurai Room'. The latter has modern equipment which allows for multimedia projections. Film showings, concerts and meetings with authors and artists are also presented at the museum.

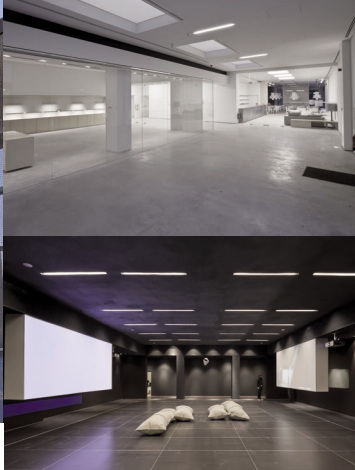

Museum of Contemporary Art in Kraków

The Museum of Contemporary Art is located in the former production halls of the Emalia factory, commonly known as the Oskar Schindler Factory.

The museum programme covers the presentation of international contemporary art, education, as well as research and publishing projects.

The museum has at its disposal 4,000 m² of the most modern exhibition area in Poland, which was divided into four galleries of permanent and temporary exhibitions. The complex also includes a library, a conservator's workshop, a bookshop, a café and a patio. Museum of Municipal Engineering in Krakow – Hall F

The Museum of Municipal Engineering in Krakow is located in the buildings of the oldest depot of a horse and electric tram in Kraków from the turn of the 19th and 20th centuries, located in the old Jewish district of Kazimierz. The museum collects, studies, documents and promotes monuments of technology, industry and city engineering. The collection includes items related to city engineering, the history of public transport in Kraków, the development of the motor industry in Poland, as well as industry and craftsmanship.

To the organisers of concerts, banquets and social events, the Museum offers the historic F Hall – the electric tram depot erected in 1913.

During the summer, the museum invites guests to evening meetings at the Stanisław Lem Experiment Garden in the area of the Park of Polish Aviators.

New Main Building of the Polish Aviation Museum in Kraków

The Polish Aviation Museum in Kraków occupies a part of the area and premises of Kraków's former military airport, Rakowice-Czyżyny, one of the oldest permanent airports in Europe.

The Museum, founded in 1963, collects and presents items related to the history of aviation technology in Poland and worldwide.

In the period 2008–2010 the New Main Building was erected. The architectural shape of the building is very original – from a bird's eye view it looks like a rotating propeller. It is a great 'Gate to the Aviation Theme Park'.

Royal Castle Foundation in Niepołomice

The Royal Castle in Niepołomice was founded by Casmir the Great in the middle of the 14th century. It became a royal residence referred to as the "second Wawel". In the 16th century it was reconstructed in the Renaissance style – it was also the period when the famous gardens of queen Bona were planted. It was the venue of the crown gatherings, royal court sittings, the place where privileges were granted and legates were received, while the nearby Niepołomice Primeval Forest was a hunting place.

Oscar Schindler's Enamel Factory – cinema room

The administration building of the former Oscar Schindler's Factory on ul. Lipowa 4 is a branch of the Historical Museum of the City of Kraków, devoted to the wartime history of the city and its inhabitants. The story of the factory, its owner and the Jewish prisoners of the Płaszów camp whom he saved is commonly known thanks to Steven Spielberg's film *Schindler's List*.

The exhibition entitled 'Kraków under Nazi Occupation 1939-1945' presented at the museum shows the story of Schindler's factory in a broader historic context and gives visitors the possibility to understand this part of the city's history in a more profound way.

Pod Baranami Palace

The Renaissance Pod Baranami Palace was erected in the 16th century. Its owners used to be representatives of Polish noble families. As from 19th century, it has belonged to the Potocki family.

The Palace hosted also many celebrities: Alexy, a Russian tsarevitch, Prince Józef Poniatowski, Saxon king Frederic August and the emperor Franz Josef I.

Converted in the Middle of the 19th century, the palace became the first salon of Kraków, which was the venue of famous balls.

The Stary Theatre (Narodowy Stary Teatr im. Heleny Modrzejewskiej)

The Stary Theatre is a theatre of tradition: it emphasises more than two hundred years of its history for a reason. In its home on ul. Jagiellońska, in beautiful Renaissance city houses (combined and adopted for the purposes of theatre activity), a theatre troupe has performed as from 1781.

Wieliczka Salt Mine Tourist Route

The Wieliczka Salt Mine is the only mining site in the world which has been continuously operating since the Middle Ages and is one of the most famous tourist destinations in Poland. In 1978 it was registered on the I UNESCO List of World Natural and Cultural Heritage.

Villa Decius

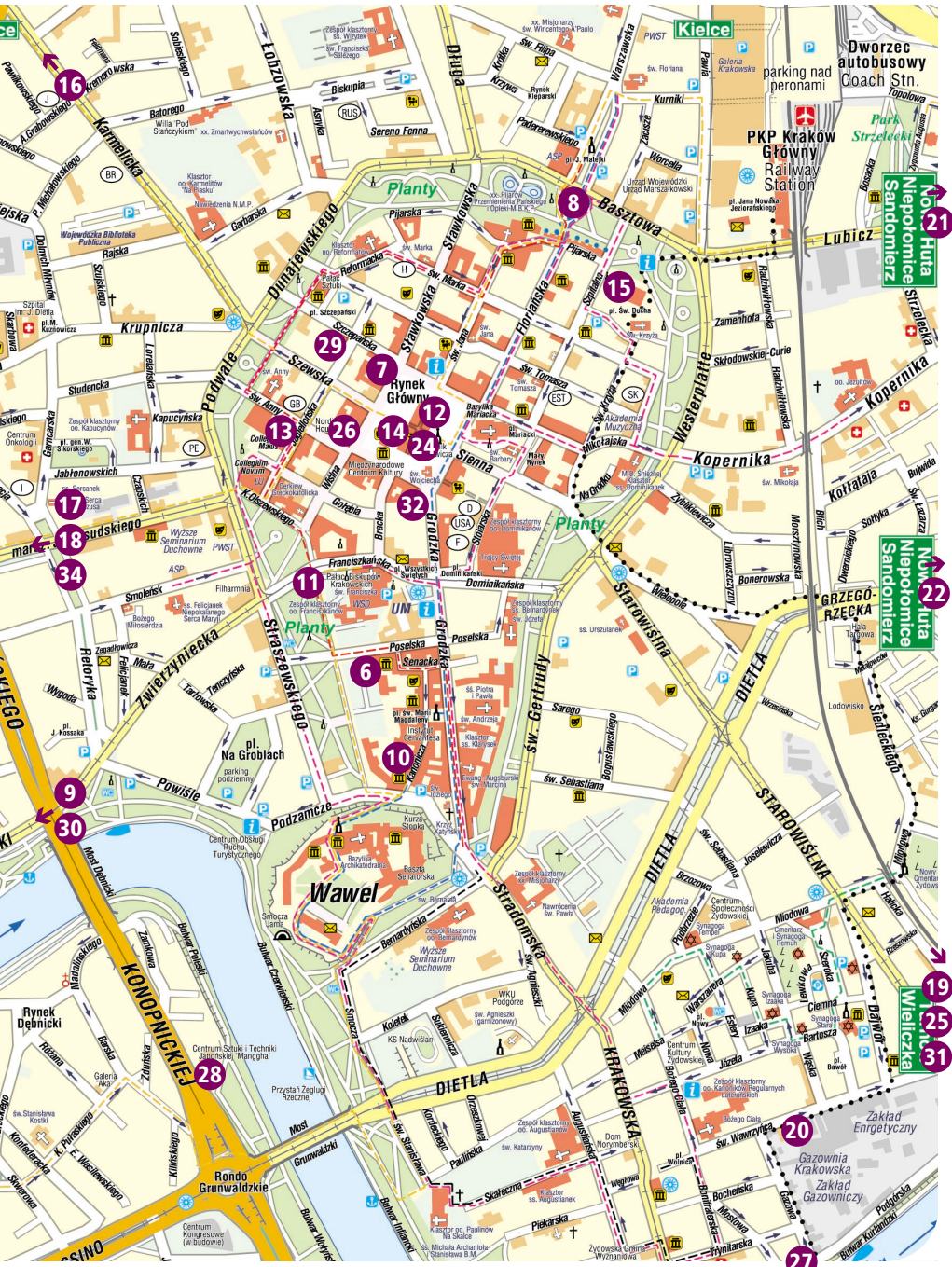
